VANCOUVER, OCTOBER 6 — We witness homelessness every day: in the news, outside our windows and in our lives. We hear about organizations and government trying to solve the issue. We know solutions exist, but how do we tap into them?

In all the controversy surrounding the homeless emergency in Metro Vancouver, how *do* we create safe and affordable housing in the region? What services do we need for supported housing? Where do we find the space for this? These are just a few of the questions Headlines Theatre will be tackling in their 2009 production **after homelessness...** running November 21 to 29 at the Firehall Arts Centre in Vancouver and December 1 to 6 at the Holy Trinity Cathedral in New Westminster.

Directed by David Diamond and created and performed by people who have been homeless, and have lived with issues of mental health, **after homelessness...** will explore the subject of supported and affordable housing through Forum Theatre. The process begins with a week-long workshop of twenty people including the five cast members to explore these issues in their lives. The cast, director and professional design team then have three weeks to create the play. The play is interactive and acts as a vehicle for change as audience members take the stage to illustrate their distinct perspectives and solutions.

Theatre making policy

These performances will give the homeless community and the general public a creative venue to use theatre to inform policy. The **after homelessness...** project will generate a Community Action Report which will be received by the following organizations for use in their respective research for national, provincial, regional and local strategies on mental health and homelessness:

- The Mental Health Commission of Canada
- BC Housing
- The City of Vancouver
- The Greater Vancouver Regional Steering Committee on Homelessness
- RainCity Housing
- Coast Mental Health

after homelessness... has become more than a policy-producing play; the project includes a group art exhibition at Gallery Gachet for the Downtown Eastside Heart of the City Festival, November 6 to 29, and will also host a series of Community Dialogues at the Firehall Arts Centre.

The Community Dialogue Sessions: housing the homeless will get at the nuts and bolts of creating safe, affordable and supportive housing. The sessions will deal with location, financing and necessary supports and services, respectively. Moderated panels will be made up of people who have experienced homelessness, Metro Vancouver city councillors and business leaders, including: Vancouver's Assistant Director of Housing Policy Jill Davidson, RainCity Housing's Mark Smith, and BC Housing's Craig Crawford. Panelists will each present a short talk on the day's topic, followed by an open dialogue with the audience. Moderators are: Journalist Kathryn Gretsinger, Headlines' Artistic Director David Diamond and the Georgia Straight's Editor Charlie Smith. The Sessions start at 1:30pm each day, November 24, 25 and 26. Admission is free and open to the public.

after homelessness... runs November 21 to 29 at the Firehall Arts Centre in Vancouver and December 1 to 6 at the Holy Trinity Cathedral in New Westminster. Tickets are \$10 and are available for the Vancouver shows through the Firehall Box Office at 604.689.0926 and at 604.871.0508 for the shows in New Westminster. There will be a preview performance on November 20, with 2 for 1 tickets. Free vouchers for both venues are available at various housing support centres.
